

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



Decisions are only taken upon deliberation of all possible viewpoints


Decisions are taken on the basis of a synopsis of arguments, not by vote.





Landscape action as policy arrangement




Policy arrangement visualized as a tetrahedron from Duncan Liefferink (2006).

- Begun 1964
- 2,000 acres across 5 municipalities
- Expected population 50,000
- Expected industries 1,000
- Current population 13,000 (5 municipalities) or 5,000 (Zingonia alone)
- 0.89 jobs for each inhabitant
- Home to major corporations
 - Headquarters of Atalanta Football Team
 - Premier manufacturing, health and service industries
