



- → Bottom-up design and planning | critical need for designers & planners who can effectively work in partnership with communities they serve


















Online Course | Seminar Structure April- June 2016

Who can participate in the online module, and what do I get?

Participation in this course can be done passively or actively. It is open to students in all study programmes. Academic recognition for successful completion will be as follows:

MAX. 10 ECTS IN TOTAL

Who can participate in the on-site workshop in Zingonia?

Only students who have successfully completed the online program as active participants and are registered at one of the partner universities can participate in the Zingonia workshop. Participation is limited to five students per partner university. A small own contribution (max 100 Euro) will be required.

A limited number in addition to this may be able to participate on a self-paid basis, depending on interest.

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Introduction

The landscape belongs to everyone. We should all have equal access to it and a voice in how it is used valued and

maintained. However, spatial planning education rarely includes considerations of democratic processes, participatory planning, community design and landscape stewardship. Furthermore, it does not fully prepare young practioners to become leaders in promoting democratic landscape change and work effectively in partnership with communities.

The idea behind the LED (Landscape Education for Democracy) project, a partnership between 5 European landscape architecture faculties and the LE:NOTRE Institute is to promote awareness and empower young design and planning professional to become more active in shaping democratic change. The project employs interdisciplinary, problem-based learning environments and curricular innovation to introduce
